
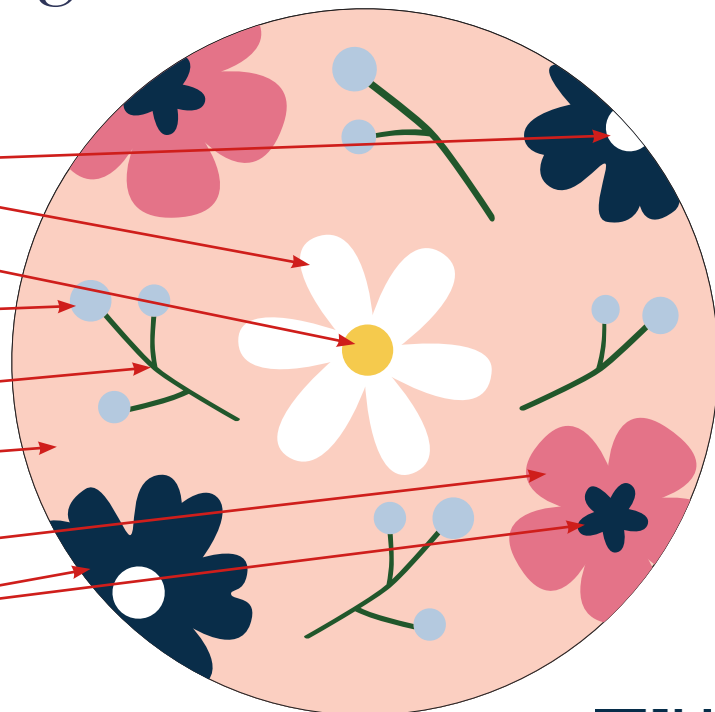


# Morning Blossoms

-  7. Navy

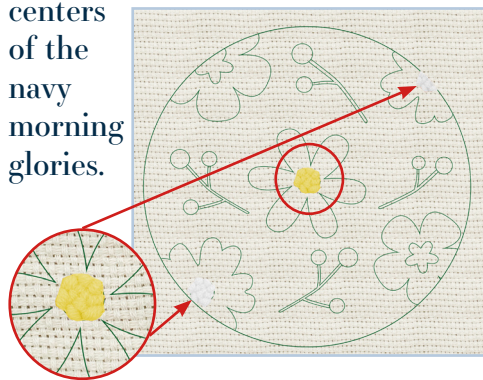

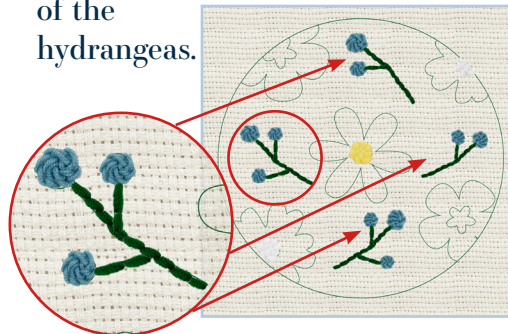


## Pattern Steps

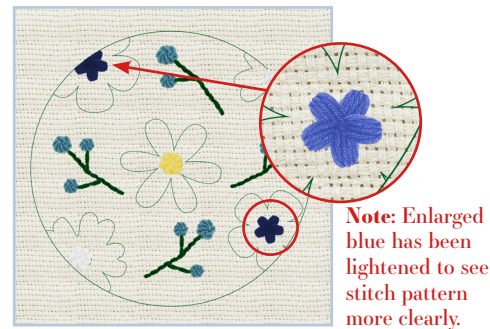
**1.** Starting with the top narrow stitch, complete the yellow daisy center, followed by the white centers of the navy morning glories.



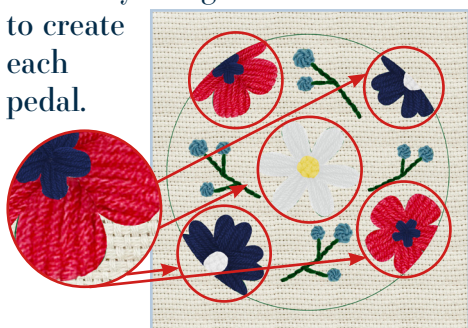
**2.** Use the needle wrap stitch to complete each of the light blue hydrangea blooms. **3.** Using the chain stitch, complete each branch of the hydrangeas.



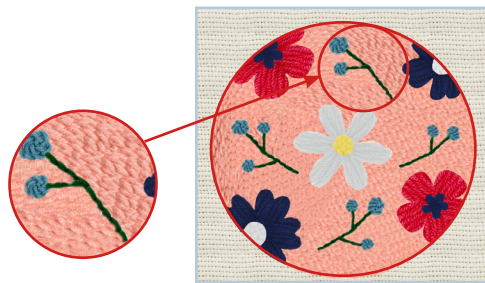
**4.** Working from the center outward, create a star pattern using the satin stitch on the dark pink forget-me-nots.



**5.** Complete each blossom of the morning glories, forget-me-nots, and daisy using the satin stitch to create each pedal.



**6.** Working from the outside toward the center, use the top stitch to fill in the coral background and complete the pattern.

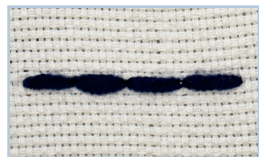

## Stitches You Will Use

top stitch



top narrow stitch



chain stitch



satin stitch



needle wrap stitch



## Embroidery Hoop Setup

1. Separate the inner hoop from the outer hoop by twisting the screw at the top of the outer hoop.



2. Place the fabric over the inner hoop, centering the design.



3. Secure the fabric by placing the outer hoop around the edge of the fabric. Gently pull the fabric around the edge so the surface is taut.

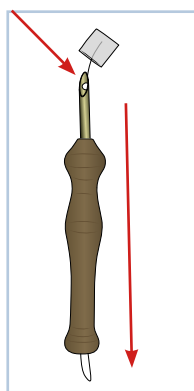


4. Partially tighten the screw at the top and then pull the fabric all the way around before tightening the screw all the way.

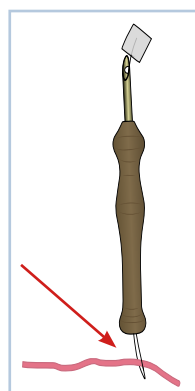


## Threading Your Punch Needle

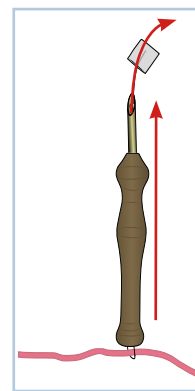
1. Feed the wire threader through the punch needle, from the top to the bottom.



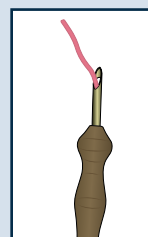
2. Place the yarn through the eye of the threader at the bottom of the punch needle.



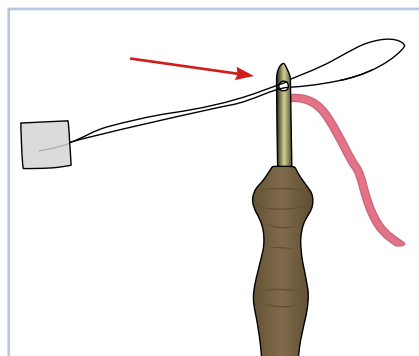
3. Pull the threader (with yarn) back up through the punch needle.



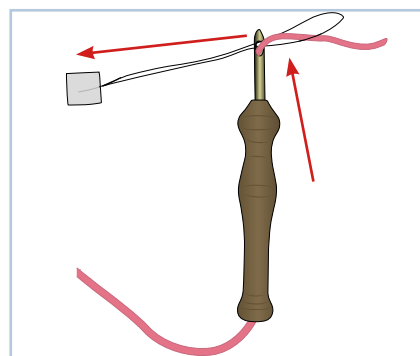
At this point, your needle should look like this.



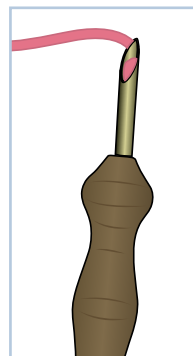
4. Place the threader through the hole at the top, from the back (taller side) toward the front.



5. Place the yarn through the threader, and pull the threader back through the hole. Release the threader.



Your threaded punch needle should look like this.
